Programme content

MODULE 1 (full-time)

5 weeks in one of the regional hubs hosted by a partner institution

- Analyse public policies and local/international actors at a regional level
- Acquire analytical and methodological skills (professional thesis)
- Manage development projects with a strategic perspective

MODULE 2 (part-time) - *Executive Master only*

4 months at your place of work

- Investigate and write your professional thesis (topic relevant to your work and your organisation's needs)
- Study gender through e-learning

MODULE 3 (full-time) - *Executive Master only*

3 weeks in international Geneva

- Strengthen your leadership skills (mediation, negotiation, foresight)
- Present your professional thesis in public
- Participate in work sessions with public administrations, international and non-governmental organisations
